# Election candidates speak to nearly 200 cyclists at Space for Cycling rally in Oxford

A crowd of nearly 200 cyclists gathered outside County Hall yesterday to hear what candidates from all four political parties in the current County Council had to say about Space for Cycling. 36 candidates have now registered or expressed their support for Space for Cycling.

"It's great to see 'soap box democracy' back in action," said Robin Tucker, Chair of the Oxfordshire Cycling Network who organised the event. "We've given candidates a platform to talk about an important local topic where the County Council exerts real control. We've brought together an audience of nearly 200 cyclists and supporters from every District in the county, as far afield as Faringdon, Wallingford and Witney. The nine candidates who spoke really got their message across, they recognised the importance of enabling more people to choose cycling in safety, and set out what their priorities would be if they got elected."



Robin Tucker started by reminding the assembly of the potential benefits of cycling, as set out in the Cycling and Walking Investment Strategy that the UK Government's Department of Transport had launched the day before. "If we can increase levels of walking and cycling, the benefits are substantial. For people, it means cheaper travel and better health. For businesses, it means increased productivity and increased footfall in shops. And for society as a whole it means lower congestion, better air quality, and vibrant, attractive places and communities."

He outlined the pivotal role that Oxfordshire County Council plays in gaining those benefits for the residents of the county. "We need the Council to do three things. To **Plan, Invest and Build Space** for Cycling. So we want more Councillors supporting cycling, and with the clear strong mandate that comes from the crowd here today and thousands of others beside them."

Simon Hunt, Chair of Cyclox asked people to 'Vote Bike'. "Check Cycling UK's Vote Bike web page to find which of your local candidates support Space for Cycling<sup>2</sup>, and then 'Vote Bike'!"

Nine candidates from four political parties then address the group. They talked about their views of the importance of cycling and how to improve conditions for cycling. Some focused on the benefits of cycling, like the health benefits. Others focused on the routes themselves, the danger of potholes and the need for high quality tracks separate from motor traffic if we are to realise the full benefits of cycling.

The speakers, in order of appearance were:

- Helen Evans, Labour candidate for Iffley Fields and St. Mary's, who took a break from a friend's wedding and cycled across Oxford to speak.
- David Grant, Liberal Democrat candidate for Faringdon, who rode in with the Farcycles group.
- Councillor David Williams, Green Party candidate for Iffley Fields and St. Mary's and leader of the Green group in the current Council.
- Dr. Suzanne Bartington, Conservative candidate for Witney North and East, who in with the Windrush group. As a medical doctor, she emphasised the importance of health benefits.
- Hazel Dawe, Green Party candidate for Cowley, a passionate advocate for sustainable transport.
- Councillor John Howson, candidate for the Liberal Democrats in St. Margaret's, Oxford who explained how Liberal Democrats on the current Council were working for cycling.
- Lucas Bertholdi-Saad, Labour candidate for Wolvercote and Summertown, and President of Wadham College Student's Union.
- Judy Roberts, Liberal Democrat candidate for North Hinksey, who spoke of her support for the B4044 community path
- Tim Bearder, Liberal Democrat candidate for Eynsham, who spoke of the urgent need to act and improve routes for cyclists.

Three further candidates were also present to show their support for Space for Cycling.

- Peter Coggins, Liberal Democrat candidate for Churchill and Lye Valley
- Denise Macdonald, Labour candidate for Didcot East and Hagbourne
- Pam Siggers, Labour candidate for Didcot Ladygrove
